

Lighting of the Advent Candle

Responsive Scripture: Zephaniah 3:14-20 (W=Women, M=Men)

W: Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exalt with all your heart.

M: The Lord has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies.

W: The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.

M: On that day it shall be said: Do not fear, O Zion, do not let your hands grow weak.

W: The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory;

M: he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you with his love.

W: God will remove disaster from you so that you do not bear reproach.

M: God will save the lame and gather the outcast, and will change their shame into praise.

W: At that time God will bring you home, gather you, and make you renowned and praised among all the families of the earth.

M: Then our fortunes will be restored before our eyes.

First Reading:

Isaiah 12:2-6

Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid,
for the Lord God is my strength and my might;
he has become my salvation.

With joy you shall draw water from the wells of salvation.

And you will say in that day:

Give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name;
make known his deeds among the nations;
proclaim that his name is to be exalted.

Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously;
let this be known in all the earth.

Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion,
for great in your midst is the Holy One of Zion

Epistle Reading:

Philippians 4:4-7

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Reading:

Luke 3:7-18

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, “You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath that is to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our ancestor’; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.”

And the crowds asked him, “What then should we do?” In reply he said to them, “Whoever had two coats must share with one who had none; and whoever has food must do likewise.” Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, “Teacher, what should we do?” He said to them, “Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.” Soldiers also asked him, “And we, what should we do?” He said to them, “Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.”

As people were filled with expectation, and were all questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.

So with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.
